Over the last year, Achut has shared her story with schools, professional groups, churches, conferences, and several national news organizations including The New York Times, The Daily Podcast, The Atlantic, NPR, The Boston Globe, the Associated Press, and Amna Nawaz of PBS NewsHour.

Achut will speak Thursday morning and sign books previously purchased.

Wounded Knee...Three Women. Three Stories, Three Cultures This play creates an opportunity for awareness and healing in South Dakota as we remember and reflect. Geraldine Goes In Center portrays Sitting Bull's daughter, Lillian Witt portrays Sadie Babcock (a rancher's wife), and Joyce **Jefferson** portrays Mattie Elmira Richardson (engaged to a Buffalo Soldier). Each performer researched and wrote her part of the historical interpretation of the events leading up to the massacre at Wounded Knee Creek in 1890. Their performance is Thursday following the Banquet.

Churchwide Rep Anna Jetson fills many roles: granddaughter, daughter, sister, child of God, friend, neighbor, co-worker, leader, board member, and church geek, to name a few.

A lifelong Lutheran, Anna began teaching Sunday school as a teen and was active in camp and Campus Ministry during college. She is active in Highland Evangelical Lutheran

Church, rural Decorah, Iowa. Anna has served at the unit, conference, and synodical levels and been to five triennial gatherings/conventions.

She currently lives on a farm at the edge of Minnesota, lowa, and Wisconsin with cats Beatrix and Keke. She enjoys reading, hardanger embroidery, tatting, crocheting, and spending time with family and friends.

Her home congregation in Ohio provided meals to folks and accompanied those living with HIV/AIDS in Hospice Homes. These experiences led her to earn her Bachelor of Social Work before answering



her call to ordained ministry. She's served for 16 years in Watertown and Sioux Falls.




share how their love reaches our neighbors throughout the globe.

Our 36th Annual Synodical Convention was held at Calvary Lutheran Church in Rapid City, which is in our Bear Butte Conference. There were 76 women in

attendance. The theme was "All Are Welcome" and our theme verse was I Corinthians 16:14, "Let all that you do, be done in Love." We had evening vespers at the Chapel in the Hills on Wednesday evening. Thursday's main speaker was Kelly Patterson, on sex trafficking; she is the author of a book on her true story "From Trafficked to Treasured". The day was filled with many interesting speakers, and our CW speaker from AZ was Laura Krueger. After our Business meeting, we closed Friday morning with a Holy Communion Service.

On August 12th, 2023 our first Biennual Leadership Event for Conference Officers was held at Trinity Lutheran Church in Chamberlain. All Conference officers were encouraged to attend to learn, ask questions, and engage in conversations with others, for the purpose of strengthening their leadership skills.

On September 21-24, 19 women from South Dakota went to Phoenix AZ, for the Twelfth Triennial Convention. The 4 voting delegates were Sherry Archer, Kathy Heffernan, Lois Storm, and Darla Toben. Our Main Theme was "Just Love" through the lens of immigration, migration, and human trafficking. Two of our Key Speakers were Dr. Jacqueline Bussie, who is the author of a book: "Love Without Limits" and Dr. Kelly Sherman-Conroy, a Native American, who shared stories of the atrocities that her ancestors went through. Also, as speakers, were several students from various foreign countries who addressed racism, homesickness, and learning a new language, etc. We had choices on different workshops to choose from and they were very interesting. It was wonderful to be there. Each of the 7 Conferences in the state have a

We thank the women of our synod for the many ways that they serve in their churches and communities and are really the hands, feet, and heart of all our 7 conferences across SD. We pray that together we can bring hope and joy as we work together into the future.
