The recipients were Helen Merriman (Bear Butte), Rosalie Gerdes and Millie Horter (Crossroads), Rachel Hemke (Northern Plains), Deanell Backlund (Prairie Rivers), and Cynthia Marohl and Deborah Pravecek (Southeastern Conference).

The SWO convention provided \$4,213. Another \$895 was given as a love offering to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, along with quilts and other items. Donations to Katie's Fund totaled \$316. Thank you all! This shows

our organization's energy and generosity.

I encourage all women to participate in your conference Fall meetings or retreats. These events offer valuable opportunities for networking, learning more about Women of the ELCA, and engaging in enriching experiences.
