Incorporation of the South Dakota Synod

The synod's legal counsel had recommended to incorporate the synod in the State of South Dakota. When the ELCA was formed, each synod was incorporated into the state of the regional office. For the South Dakota Synod, that means the State of Minnesota. The Synod Council will need to approve moving forward and permit Bishop Hagmaier to engage in consultation with the ELCA.

Partner Greeting

Rebecca Kiesow Knutson, Executive Director of Lutheran Social Services of South Dakota, brought a greeting and report from LSS. Just about every service of LSS was affected by COVID-19. Significant federal support has helped the organization maintain services.

A member asked if LSS was helping to resettle refugees from Ukraine. At this moment, most Refugees from Ukraine are being housed and Europe and have not engaged the long process for resettlement in the United States.

LSS is beginning a new program to offer early intervention for families at the early stages of child protection. A pilate program is being funded in part by a grant from the national branch of Lutheran Services in America.

LSS is also undergoing the process of re-accreditation that offers accountability and support, especially with work over children.

South Dakota Cares is a new fundraising endeavor to move away from benefit dinners to current and more effective ways of supporting the work of LSS. The full release will be May 17<sup>th</sup>.

# **Bishop's Report**

Bishops met in retreat in March; it was the first in-person meeting of the conference of Bishops in two years. There has been a lot of changeover in the conference in that time.

The Churchwide Assembly is scheduled for August 2022. The synod office is working towards gathering Voting Members ahead of time in order to best prepare for the experience. Information at the assembly comes, and we want to make sure our members are well equipped. Of note, the Churchwide Assembly will elect a vice-president after the death of Bill Horne. Carla Borchardt, former vice-president of the South Dakota Synod, has agreed to be nominated for the position.

# Farm to Table Dinner

The long-awaited Farm to Table Dinner will be happening in August. Funds raised will help to support the Rural Ministry Liaison position and renewal efforts in rural congregations. The council is encouraged to attend if they are available.

# Synod Youth Day

With the cancellation of the ELCA Youth Gathering, the synod will host a Youth Day on July 25. This will be an opportunity for young people from across the synod to come together for a day of activities and service. More details to follow.

# Rural Mental Health

Access to mental health care services in rural communities continues to be a challenge, but more is available now than ever before through telemedicine. This continues to be a concern and priority for the bishop and LSS as they place to reintroduce Mental Health First Aid and Psychological Health First Aid.

# Rural Ministry Strategic Vision

The bishop formed a task force to explore a wider strategic plan for supporting rural ministries. Some ideas already in the works are a "J-term plunge" in January 2024, through Wartburg Seminary. Wartburg Seminary offers a rural ministry class each year, but they have never come to South Dakota for the experience. The bishop is also exploring ideas to help equip lay leaders in leading prayers, worship, and community care. This can help to fill a void in pastoral vacancies and make a more substantial resource base for supporting congregation leaders everywhere. The last part of the strategy is to have six Rural Ministry liaisons.

#### Rural Ministry Liasion Report

Pastor Allen Blankenfeld has been busy on the road and spent time with three congregations in the absence of a called pastor. The initial reports and comments from participating congregations are positive. It offers the congregation a two-week period of preaching, pastor visits, and leadership development. The need continues to be great to support rural congregations in times of transition or extended vacancies.

# Pastor Greg Johnson

Johnson presented a proposal for a digital resource to help congregations explore the basics of the Christian faith called "I Send You." He plans to spend much of his upcoming sabbatical filming the series that addresses questions of the faith and produces study material. It would be suitable for a lent series in rural congregations, small groups, or adult education forums. Johnson also intends to include worship material so that they might be used in services where a pastor or other lay leader is not able to lead worship.

- So far in 2022, there have been 7 Ministry Site Studies, with two more scheduled by the end of March
- So far in 2022, 7 calls have been extended, with another congregational vote to call a pastor on March 20th
- Of the 15 full-time calls accepting names at this time, 7 are currently interviewing
- We currently have 7 part-time calls ready to accept names
- Nearly every vacancy has an interim, a SAM, or lay leaders who are caring for the ministry as congregations move through the call process
- Last fall we put together a brief handbook on "how to leave well" for ministers
- Every rostered minister who is leaving a call has an exit interview with me
- The gift of the rural ministry liaison (emails we have received)
- Rostered Minister Care
- A monthly zoom call for our interims started in February 2022. 16 interims
- attended the call last month
- Monthly zoom calls for rostered ministers & Women in ministry zoom call once a
- month
- We have 5 first call peer mentor groups that meet regularly with a facilitator and 1 new peer mentor group made up of all women rostered ministers
- Lay Leader Night in February: "I'm elected to council, now what?" nearly 95 participants

- Open Door: SD Synod LGBTQIA+2S Accompaniment Team
- First Call Process
- In 2021 we received 8 new first call candidates
- We received 1 new first call candidate from a different synod (and region) in the first call process in February 2022. Then next first call process will be in April, and then again in June, July, and October
- The First Call Minister's Retreat was November 7-9 in Chamberlain. There were 24 participants and we received good feedback and all felt it was worthwhile. We are also meeting 3 other times a year over zoom
- Trends that we are seeing with the new first call process
- Movement from a national first call process to regional
- First call candidates are getting into calls faster
- It makes a lot more work for synod offices, but all agree that the pre-consultations are life-giving and a great change to the process
- Rural areas are struggling even more to receive candidates due to restrictions and candidate agency
- Candidacy
- There are 30 people in various stages of candidacy in the SD Synod
- In January, Region 3 hosted a "Discerning your Call" series and SD had the biggest showing with 14 participants
- In January, there were 2 entrance interviews and 2 endorsement interviews. There will be 2 more entrance interviews in April. In 2022, we will have at least 7 approval interviews
- We have 8 internship site congregations in SD
- We have been working on a Collaborative Learning Site through Wartburg
- Seminary in the Bear Butte Conference to begin in the fall of 2022

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Terry Johnson presented highlights of the closed out fiscal year end 01/31/2022 mission plan and the revised fiscal year end 01/31/2023 mission plan.

Johnson presented the proposed fiscal year 02/01/2023 - 01/31/2024 Mission Plan which is recommended by the Executive Committee. Johnson noted that the 2022-23 plan was revised down by about \$40,000. To cover the anticipated deficit, the executive committee decreased the Mission Support passed along to the churchwide organization from 45% to 43%. The proposed 2023-24 Mission Plan maintains the 43% level of Mission Support to the churchwide organization.

There is no action needed to approve the report. In addition, the term for Steve Anderson is coming to an end, and he is eligible and willing to serve a second term.

#### **Digital Ministry Community**

The Rev. Matt Spoden shared about some of the work of the Digital Ministry Task Force. The task force is dreaming up ways to inspire digital ministry in congregations. Opportunities range from ways of connecting small groups and resources like digital liturgies.

#### Synod Assembly

The Synod Council had previously acted to adopt COVID-19 protocols for the 2022 Synod Assembly that matched those of Our Savior's Lutheran Church (assembly host church). Since that time, Our Savior's has removed all COVID requirements for masks and social distancing. In order to provide an opportunity to attend the assembly as safe and less restrictive as possible, the previous policy is amended.

It is expected that voting members be vaccinated or have obtained a negative COVID test within 48 hours.
